Find a provider.

Use the Provider Locator on myuhcvision.com. Or call 1-800-638-3120. You can use the automated search feature to search by provider name, facility name or location.

Schedule an appointment.

Call the provider directly to schedule an appointment, and mention that you have UnitedHealthcare vision coverage. You will need your member ID number and if you don't have it we can look it up for you by validating your identity with key personal information such as birthdate, Social Security number and address.

Get your eye exam.

The network provider, a state-licensed ophthalmologist or optometrist, will perform a complete eye exam, which includes a case history and an examination for eye illness and vision impairment.

Should vision correction be required, your provider will give you a prescription for glasses or contacts. Should an illness or eye disorder be found, you may be referred to your health plan for medical eye coverage.

Choose eyewear.

If you need prescription eyewear, your provider can help you choose it and place an order. Prescription eyewear includes eyeglasses and/or contacts depending on your plan coverage. Once your eyewear order is complete, your provider will schedule a time for pickup. Eyewear is dispensed at the provider's office to ensure optical accuracy and proper fit. If you have any questions or concerns about your glasses or contacts let your provider know; they are there to help you both during and after your appointment.

Print an ID card.

You do not need a member ID card to use your benefits. However, if you'd like one, you can easily print one from myuhcvision.com. Simply click on "Click Here to Print Vision ID Card" under "My Benefits."
